

SELECTMEN'S MEETING
March 19, 2014

The weekly selectmen's meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Selectman Wesley Daniel. Selectman Donald Grinnell and Selectman Duane Vigue were also in attendance.

The summary of the March 12, 2014, selectmen's meeting was approved as written.

The selectmen voted unanimously to approve a payroll warrant in the amount of \$5,552.09 and an accounts payable warrant of \$5,594.74.

Jonathan Daniel, Road Commissioner, was absent but provided a written report of his activities March 9-15. The selectmen voted unanimously to accept his report.

Wes introduced Ann Wright from MMA Health Trust who explained the program for employee health insurance. She provided the selectmen with sheet outlining 7 options for employee health plans. Duane stated that only 3 employees qualified for health insurance and only two had shown interest. If the budget is approved at town meeting and the selectmen quickly determine the plan(s) to be offered, the insurance can be available May 1st.

Robert Temple, Code Enforcement Officer, was present and briefed the selectmen that the Hoffman case is scheduled for court in April and that the Read and Steinmeyer cases are being worked at the attorney's office.

FEMA will be hosting meetings at 1:00 and 6:00 on March 27 at the Rockland City Hall to review the updated floodplain maps. Bob will attend.

The selectmen voted unanimously to appoint the following ballot clerks:

Mildred Melgard, Carole Sloan, Elizabeth Bettcher, and Kimberly Mank

The selectmen received a letter from Cynthia White regarding the icy conditions on the walkway leading to the Gibbs Library the previous Saturday. Wes will review with the contractor. The selectmen also received emails from Mark Archembault and David Studor. Mr. Archembault had comments about road sanding which Duane will respond to and Mr. Studor had questions about the proposed new recreation field which Don will answer.

The selectmen voted unanimously to allow the Knox County Administrator to lock in next winter's heating fuel prices at or below the 2013-14 heating season's prices.

The selectmen signed 3-year contracts for roadside mowing with Kennedy Mowing and with Armstrong Landscaping for plowing of town grounds.

Town Treasurer, Ann Dean, reported that the Workers Compensation audit for 2013 had been completed.

Dorothy Sainio was recognized and asked that the Nelson Cemetery sign be repaired or replaced. Duane responded that the project was scheduled and would be completed before Memorial Day.

With nothing additional to come before the Board, the selectmen adjourned at 8:10 pm.
