

SELECTMEN and ASSESSORS MEETING
May 21, 2014

The weekly selectmen's meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Selectman Wesley Daniel. Selectmen Donald Grinnell and Duane Vigue were also in attendance.

The summary of the May 14, 2014, selectmen's meeting was approved as written.

The selectmen voted unanimously to approve a payroll warrant in the amount of \$3,000.91 and an accounts payable warrant of \$14,940.39 that included a payment of \$2,871.00 for legal fees for several land use violation cases. Those legal fees are often recouped when the cases are judged. The selectmen reviewed the TRIO expense report dated May 21st.

Jonathan Daniel, Road Commissioner, was absent and had no written report. Duane expects to mail out paving bid notices and specifications early the week of May 26th.

Robert Temple, Code Enforcement officer, was present and briefed the selectmen on the following:

- 1) Bob has been asked by the attorney in the Linscott land use violation case to provide a deposition. He will be deposed at the town attorney's office on a date to be determined.

The selectmen voted unanimously to approve a policy regarding providing motor vehicle registrations and other transactions for residents of other municipalities.

At the request of the town clerk, Fairpoint Communications has installed a phone in the vault. This will provide a better sense of security for workers.

After an email request from Paul Dodge, regarding the status of the discontinued portion of Nelson Ridge Road, the selectmen determined that the discontinuance occurred prior to 1965, which, according to Maine State Law means that there is no public easement or right-of-way. Don will inform Mr. Dodge.

The selectmen voted unanimously to award the 2014-2105 winter salt bid to Morton Salt at \$55.89 delivered which is up less than \$1.00 from last year. The bid was part of the Knox County consolidated municipal salt and sand bid process.

With nothing additional to come before the Board, the selectmen adjourned at 7:23 pm.
