

Selectmen/Assessor's Meeting Summary
November 2, 2016

In attendance: Select Board – Wesley Daniel, Tom Johnston, Berkley Linscott; CEO – Bob Temple; Town Clerk/Treasurer – Ann Dean; Public – Lynn Carroll, Jane Carroll, Kit Lascoutx, Dave Martucci

Wesley Daniel called the meeting to order at 7:00PM.

Tom Johnston moved to accept the summary from 10/26/16 as written, Berkley Linscott seconded, all in favor.

Tom Johnston moved to pay the warrants as presented \$3,749.13/payroll, \$3,491.39/vender, Berkley Linscott seconded, all in favor.

Public Works Report – 10/23 – 10/29 – 24th – 27th Worked on P200 getting ready to paint it, took P100 and P 200 for inspection. One employee took a vacation day; one employee took a sick day. Tom Johnston moved to accept the Public Works Report as read, Berkley Linscott seconded, all in favor.

CEO Report – Bob Temple stated that he's finished all the gravel pit inspections except one. Tom Johnston asked where these inspections are stored. Mary Anderson said a CD is in the vault and a copy is in a folder on one of the computers. Bob is also working on the Shoreland Zoning with the Planning Board who will meet in December. Tina Hall is working on a non-conforming lot for a relative for the Planning Board to review. Kit Lascoutx asked Bob if there is one house in the Floodplain. Wesley Daniel said there is one.

Town Clerk/Treasurer Report – Ann Dean reported that she has added Jesse Casas to the list of people attending the December 8 training for the Planning and Appeal Board members. The excise tax analytical review is done for 2008 – 2016. Andy Dinsmore completed his ACO training on 10/28. Linda Pease from MVHS called regarding Wreaths Across America to ask if someone could be present to accept the wreath for the town on Sunday, 12/11 at 3PM at the high school. The election material has been posted. We had a ballot clerk class last night to go over the new laws and rules to follow.

Wesley Daniel motioned to appoint Kathleen Ocean as a Ballot Clerk, Tom Johnston seconded, all in favor.

The Selectmen signed a Quitclaim Deed for a Davis Daggett cemetery plot, north half of plot 63.

The Selectmen will meet at 6PM on November 16, and December 7th and 21st to go over the budget before the regularly scheduled meeting at 7PM. This will be posted.

Questions and Comments

Wesley Daniel stated that he received an invitation from the Maine Department of Transportation to participate in a Region 5 Transit Workshop to be held on Monday, November 14, 2016 from 1:30 – 3:30pm to talk about public transportation in this area. Wesley Daniel will attend. Ann Dean would like to attend.

Wesley Daniel stated that we received \$1,593.00 from MEMA for the 2016 EMP Expenditures reimbursement.

Ann Dean stated that we received the 2015 Tree Growth Reimbursement, \$3,900.

Ann Dean will ask Priscilla Packard if the Grange could use the old air conditioner from the town office.

David Martucci talked about the Comprehensive Plan Review Committee's Survey to be mailed. The Copy Center will print 1100 on 20lb paper, folded for \$135.00; 684 will be mailed in bulk at .19/ea; \$130.00 and out of town mailings is 332 and will cost about \$157.00. Ann Dean gave David a tax-exempt form and a purchase order for The Copy Center. The money will come out of the Postage and Selectmen's Discretionary line. The committee will not be giving out survey's during the election.

Kit Lascoux will be in the library, during the elections, with three different items of interest. Emergency Management handouts; Town Post-City Watch System signups; Get the word out about the Warming Shelter which is in the basement of the Masons Hall and will hold an open house on December 10.

Kit Lascoux suggested we be prepared, as a town, to address the issue if referendum #1 passes. He knows of another town who has decided on a moratorium for six months or will entertain the idea of a moratorium on establishments and clubs for marijuana so they have time to sort out zoning and what would be appropriate, near schools, etc. Kit was also informed that there are 32 medicinal growers in Washington. As a town, we have the ability to set up our own ordinance. David Martucci stated that this is a good point and we may need to amend our ordinance to be a little more specific. If the law passes, it's a specific type of retail business, different from other retail businesses.

Wesley Daniel adjourned the meeting at 7:37PM.
