

SELECTMEN'S MEETING SUMMARY
May 23, 2012

The weekly selectmen's meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Selectman Wesley Daniel. Selectmen Donald Grinnell and Duane Vigue were also present.

The summary of the May 16, 2012, selectmen's meeting was approved as written.

The selectmen voted unanimously to approve a payroll warrant totaling \$2,918.73 and a vendor warrant in the amount of \$5,865.01 which left a balance of \$100,000 in the operating account and \$207,577.30 in the interest bearing sweep account. The selectmen reviewed the TRIO General Ledger, Revenue and Expense reports dated May 23rd.

Frank Jones, Jr., Road Commissioner, was absent and had no written report. The required welding training will be conducted onsite at the town garage on Tuesday, June 5th at 1:00 pm.

Robert Temple, Code Enforcement Officer was present but had no written report.

Charlotte Henderson was recognized and stated that the Washington Historical Society would be holding outdoor concerts on July 11th and 18th near the new patio at the Gibbs Library. She asked if the selectmen could move their meetings in the event of inclement weather. The selectmen agreed they could move to the library or the fire department training room.

The selectmen and code enforcement officer made a final review of the new fee schedule and voted unanimously to approve it with an effective date of June 1st.

The selectmen will post the roadside mowing bid notice next week after approval at the selectmen's meeting.

The Commissioner of the Maine Department of Education has approved the MSAD reapportionment plan which had been voted on by the reapportionment committee and submitted by Superintendent Susan Pratt. Washington keeps its two school board members. A copy of the plan is on file at the town office.

The selectmen will host a public hearing on proposed amendments Appendices A, B, and C to the Washington General Assistance Ordinance on Wednesday, June 13, 2012, at 7:00 pm in the Bryant Room of the Gibbs Library. The Maine State Legislature voted to revise limits on various general assistance limits, thus requiring amendment of local ordinances.

The review and update of the Hazard mitigation list required by FEMA has been completed and submitted to Knox County.

Don announced that the flags had been placed on all veterans graves by Jud Butterman and Don.

With no additional business to come before the board, the selectmen adjourned at 7:40 pm.
