

SELECTMEN and ASSESSORS MEETING
September 3, 2014

The weekly selectmen's meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Selectman Wesley Daniel. Selectmen Donald Grinnell and Duane Vigue were also in attendance.

The summary of the August 27, 2014, selectmen and assessors meeting was approved as written.

The selectmen voted unanimously to approve a payroll warrant in the amount of \$4,907.70 and an accounts payable warrant of \$2,676.4153.

Jonathan Daniel, Road Commissioner, was absent but provided a written report of his activities for the period Aug 24-30. The selectmen voted unanimously to accept his report.

Robert Temple, Code Enforcement Officer, was absent with a medical emergency.

The selectmen reviewed a letter from Knox County Clerk of Courts that named Paul L. Gibbons, Esq. as mediator in the land use violation case brought before the Court by the Town of Washington against Berkley and Nancy Linscott. The town will be represented by its attorney Fred Newcombe and the Linscott's will be represented by Patrick Mallor. No date for the mediation has been set.

The town has applied for a Maine Municipal Association Safety Grant for a "Dump-Loc", a device to be used at the town garage to ensure the dump bodies do not collapse when workers are making repairs under it.

The selectmen continue to seek quotes for a panic button, low-temperature alarm, and fire alarm for the town office/library.

The selectmen voted unanimously to have Wes mow the old town dump site as is required annually by MeDEP.

The selectmen reviewed the three applications for the vacancy on the road maintenance crew. They will select an interview date next week.

With no further business to come before the board the selectmen adjourned at 7:22 pm.
