

SELECTMAN'S MEETING

JANUARY 16, 2013

The weekly Selectman's meeting was called to order by Selectman Wes Daniel at 7:00 pm. Selectman Duane Vigue was present with Selectman Don Grinnell absent.

The Selectman voted unanimously to approve the summary of the Selectman's meeting dated January 9th 2013.

The Selectman voted unanimously to approve a payroll warrant in the amount of \$3353.72 and a vendor warrant in the amount of \$123,726.61 which included the school payment.

Road Commissioner Jonathon Daniel was absent but provided a written report. The report was approved as written.

Code Enforcement Officer Bob temple was present but provided no written report. He was accompanied by Mr. Jeff Reed who is representing his mother concerning violation on their Calderwood Rd. residence. Bob is reviewing the clean up work that has taken place there and is also reporting to Mr. Reed any additional clean up that must occur to become in compliance with our land use ordinance. Bob will also contact the town attorney to help provide a payment schedule for the Reeds to comply with fines and court costs incurred by them. Bob will also visit Tim Jackson's old salvage yard located on route 17 to see if he is in compliance with an order to clean out the old yard and relocate all items to the new yard on route 17.

The Selectman voted unanimously NOT to close the Mcdowell Rd. to thru truck traffic. This decision was reached after hearing from town residents on both sides of the issue. There was a letter received by Nancy and Berkley Linscotts letter referring to this issue but it was not a fact based letter nor was it used as a factor in the decision making process.

The Washington Lakes Association has requested permission to place a milfoil sign at the boat landing on route 105. The Dept. of Conservation will supply the sign and the Lakes Association will install the sign.

John Medika was present and told that his property on Washington Pond was now legally property of the Town Of Washington. The Town had received several checks from the Trust involved with the Medika property but the monies were received well after the 60 day grace period. The monies will be returned to the Trust and the matter will be brought to the Town Meeting in March as an article.

With no further business to come before the board the meeting was adjourned at 7:40.
