

**SELECTMEN and ASSESSORS MEETING**  
**September 17, 2014**

The weekly selectmen's meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Selectman Wesley Daniel. Selectmen Donald Grinnell and Duane Vigue were also in attendance.

The summary of the September 10, 2014, selectmen and assessors meeting was approved as written.

The selectmen voted unanimously to approve a payroll warrant in the amount of \$2,976.86 and an accounts payable warrant of \$10,936.36 that included the quarterly Tri-county Solid Waste assessment of \$7,775.86. The selectmen reviewed the TRIO expense report dated September 17<sup>th</sup>.

Jonathan Daniel, Road Commissioner, was absent but provided a written report of his activities for the period Sept 7-13. The selectmen voted unanimously to accept his report. Paving of the Mountain Road by Lane, Inc. is expected to begin Oct 9<sup>th</sup>.

Robert Temple, Code Enforcement Officer, was present and briefed the selectmen on the following:

- 1) Pike Industries will be blasting tomorrow on its property off Jefferson Road. Bob will be present.
- 2) Pike Industries has informed Bob that they will be replacing old outdated plant equipment throughout the fall and winter months.
- 3) Bob will be contacting Sitework Stone (formerly Frasier's Gravel) about expansion of their operation east of Waldoboro Road in the vicinity of Davis-Daggett Cemetery.
- 4) He will be doing gravel pit inspections of the Bartlett, Boynton, Vanner, and Town of Waldoboro gravel pits on Friday.
- 5) At the recommendation of the town attorney, Bob will be reinitiating a complaint against Larry Sukeforth for an illegal stump dump on his property off Razorville Road.
- 6) On Tuesday, September 16<sup>th</sup>, Bob, Don, and Duane met with two Maine DEP representatives to discuss the State of Maine Wellhead Protection Program and the possible effect it could have on the body shop application by Troy Hatch. DEP will come out next Tuesday to determine exact distances from four wellheads for the proposed shop. The distances will be determined using GPS instruments.

Wes read a letter from Bette Pelletier resigning her position on the Scholarship Committee. The selectmen voted unanimously to accept the resignation with regret and to thank Bette for her service to the town.

The selectmen have re-scheduled the annual automobile graveyard inspections. The inspections will now be done on Friday, September 26<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 am.

At 7:18 pm the selectmen entered executive session under 1 M.R.S. § 405(6) (A) to discuss the results of the interviews conducted to fill a vacancy on the road crew. They returned to regular session at 7:24 pm and voted unanimously to appoint Jason Andrews as the new road crew equipment operator effective on or about October 1<sup>st</sup> as soon as Jason has worked his notice at his current employer. They also voted to offer a position of on-call plow driver to Jody Seekins.

The selectmen scheduled a meeting with the roads committee on October 15<sup>th</sup> after the selectmen's meeting.

The selectmen voted unanimously to buy a new clock for the Bryant Room.

Don will call DEP about spreading gravel at the boat ramp on Crystal Lake.

With no further business to come before the board the selectmen adjourned at 7:42 pm.
