



Selectmen's /Assessors Meeting Summary

March 18, 2020

Wesley Daniel called the Selectmen's Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Approve Summary of March 11, 2020: Motion to approve summary by Tom Johnston, Berkley Linscott 2nd, All in favor, Motion's carried.

Road Foreman Report: Written by Frank Jones, Jr. and read by Wesley Daniel:

3/9/2020 6:30am-4:30pm: We took fuel tank out of P-200, it was leaking, took it to Donald Bowman and I went to White & Bradstreet to find a strap, got a pair for \$100, Portland North was \$204 a strap and \$398.75 a brace=\$1200; Kevin and Greg patched holes on tar roads.

3/10/2020 6:30am-4:30pm: We worked on P-200 straps and sandblasted the frame; I told the home owner at 144 McDowell Road no hauling gravel to fix driveway.

3/11/2020 6:30am-4:30pm: We painted straps and frame on P-200; We checked dirt roads for mud.

3/12/2020 6:30am-3:30pm: Kevin had a doctor's appointment; Greg and I cleaned some of the shop and driveway, waited for parts to arrive.

CEO Report: Bob Temple was not present.

Health Officer Report: Brian Alves was not present.

Town Clerk/Treasurer's Report: Mary Anderson stated that Guy Bourrie resigned from School Board, the town now doesn't have anyone on the School Board; the bank interest rate is down to .45%; MMA sent a bulletin regarding postponing the Town Meeting, the Town is allowed to spend 1/10 of last year's budget per month until the Town Meeting can happen; The Town Meeting and Election may have to be postponed indefinitely due to the COVID-19 emergency and the Governor's suggestion that no more than 10 people should meet together; Mary can take the warrants down that have been posted around town; The Selectmen have agreed to close the Selectmen's meetings to the public for the time being, also due to the virus; the Town office has been closed with the exception of new registrations, the Governor has announced that re-registrations will be waived and once the emergency has been lifted, people will have 30 days to re-register their vehicles; the meet the candidates night will be postponed; Mary is

going to call Deb Vannah about the Food Bank and will find out if she needs any help with food distribution, if she does, Mary and Joan will help out. The bank balance is \$156,930.00.

Other Agenda Items:

-Wesley Daniel made a motion to postpone the Town Meeting and Election due to the COVID-19 emergency, Tom Johnston 2nd, All in favor, Motion's carried.

-Charlotte Henderson wanted clarification regarding no fines for vehicle re-registrations for 30 days after emergency is lifted. Mary Anderson confirmed.

-The Selectmen agreed that all public meetings and workshops are going to be cancelled or postponed.

-Wesley Daniel stated that the tree that has been slated to be taken down in West Washington Cemetery will be coming down tomorrow. The Road Crew will flag.

Question and Comments:

-Charlotte Henderson read a letter to the Selectmen that she had written in response to a complaint from a resident regarding the TCWMO Manager not being at the Transfer Station during the open hours. Charlotte wanted it to be noted that the manager does much work and may not always be at the Transfer Station. Wesley Daniel suggested that the manager document his time. The letter from Charlotte is attached.
