Wesley Daniel called the Selectmen's Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Road Foreman Report: Written by Frank Jones, Jr. and read by Wesley Daniel:

8/26/19 6:00am-4:30pm: Put up 300 yards of winter sand; the screen broke down.

8/27/19 6:00am-4:30pm: Screened about 200 yards of gravel.

8/28/19 6:00am-4:30pm: Worked on the driveway on Old Union Road. I had a doctor's appointment and came back to work.

8/29/19 6:00am-4:30pm: Greg took a sick day for a doctor's appointment. Kevin and I worked on P200 plow putting in rod and springs. Anderson came to service the loader; it will need a new gas pedal, the old one is rusting up from the salt.

Wesley Daniel stated that he has been reaching out to Greg Boynton regarding the broken screen. He is trying to determine when Greg can continue with the job.

CEO Report: Bob Temple stated that the dead-line for compliance on the property on Route 17 is approaching and he has written a finding of fact and spoke to Peter Drum about it last week. Since the owner does not want Bob on his property, Peter suggested getting an inspection warrant. Bob has inspected three more pits and is working on the reports. Bob met with Peter regarding the property on Bill Luce Road and the inspection warrant is expected soon. There isn't a Planning Board meeting this week.

Health Officer Report: None

Town Clerk/Treasurer's Report: Mary Anderson stated that she, Denise and Joan have training for SQL TRIO Thursday afternoon and we will go live when she is confident the office staff is fully trained. Mary stated that she will be off on Friday. The bank balance \$237,793.32. Dan Furrow is working out of state, he will sign the School Board Appointment papers when he returns.

Other Agenda Items:

Wesley Daniel stated that he had a poverty abatement to be approved or denied by the Selectmen. Wes made a motion to deny the abatement. Tom Johnston seconded, All in favor.

Questions and Comments:

Phil Meunier informed the Selectmen that Tanker 1 has a split frame. It needs either a new frame or a new truck. Wes asked Phil to look into reframing estimates.

Jim Kearney wanted to thank the Selectmen for the silk fences that were put up on Calderwood Road to help prevent runoff. Jim is concerned that the road crew may not have the proper training in soil erosion practices. He believes that the ditching that has been done is going to cause soil erosion and runoff into Little Medomak. He suggested that the Road Foreman take a class in soil erosion preventive practices and educate themselves regarding non-point source pollution. Jim gave the Selectmen information for an upcoming class.

Traci Hoffman stated that the temporary speed limit sign that was put up on Route 220 near the intersection of Calderwood Road is still there and has not been replaced with a permanent sign. She is going to call the DOT to inquire about the issue.
